### Impact Highlight



In partnership with Uganda Childbirth Injury Fund, we hosted a fistula camp at Kamuli Mission Hospital, providing no-cost surgical treatment for **28** women and inviting **12** women to participate in our reintegration program. UVP's Fistula Ambassadors simultaneously lead **301** community meetings, reaching **30,000+** people!

We partnered with **10** secondary schools to deliver **6** youth-focused, classroom-based reproductive health education sessions and **4** reusable sanitary pad making workshops, supporting a total of **1,398** students. To ensure that no youth is left behind, we also extend our curriculum into the local communities, reaching out to out-of-school youth and young people. This quarter, we delivered sessions in **Nabitende B, Bulumwaki, Bukalange, Naguwa, and Kalungami A** villages.

We engaged the communities of **Nabinoni Village, Bubeeko, and Butabaala**, with WASH programming, including education about the safe water chain and good hygiene practices. We repaired **5** boreholes, improving access to clean water for over **600** people and hosted **8** WASH events, supporting nearly **3,000** community members with critical water chain education and hand-washing education in primary schools.

### Bewitched No More!

Juliet's story is shared with her consent.



At a young age, Juliet left home to live with her aunt. Shortly after becoming pregnant, her aunt forced her to marry the father of her child. During her pregnancy, Juliet did not receive any antenatal care and gave birth with the help of a traditional birth attendant, labouring for nearly 24 hours. Without formal medical care, Juliet suffered the consequences of a lengthy labour and began leaking urine shortly after the birth of her child. After learning about the UVP fistula repair camps from a friend, she attended the camp at Kamuli Mission Hospital in June, and is now participating in our reintegration program and learning how to tailor.
