## OBSTETRIC FISTULA

### Two Successful Camps, Lifelong Transformations



In October, we partnered with UCIF to host a camp at Kamuli Mission Hospital, followed by a second camp in November at Kiryandongo Hospital. Across both camps, **45** women received life-changing repair surgery.

Reintegration was also a key priority in Q4. With support from ACORD and UNFPA, we provided reintegration training to **19** women. In addition, we conducted follow-up visits with **32** women who completed the reintegration program in 2024, also supported by ACORD and UNFPA. These follow-ups are essential to understanding what is working, where additional support is needed, and how women are sustaining their recovery and livelihoods over time.

## HOPE & NEW BEGINNINGS



*"For the first time in 20 years, I woke up dry."*

After living with obstetric fistula for more than 20 years, Betty finally accessed treatment she had long believed was impossible. Supported by UVP staff and encouraged by former patients, Betty received life-changing surgery at the Kiryandongo fistula camp in November and was able to return home to her family with renewed hope and dignity. ## ADOLESCENT REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH

### Building Knowledge and Practical Skills



Our ARH programme reached **4,337** adolescents last quarter through a combination of **17** in-school sessions, **5** community outreach sessions and **15** reusable sanitary pad making workshops.

Our student survey highlighted just how much impact our program has:

- Girls are more likely to stay in school during their periods instead of missing days.

- Students demonstrated a much better understanding of what causes menstruation.
- HIV/STI prevention knowledge has increased, particularly around condom usage.
